

National Skeet – Rules

Standard rules for skeet shooting apply, with the following exceptions:

1. Ammunition

The use of lead-free pellets is permitted or allowed or required by the rules of the organizing association.

2. Round

The following targets are shot in a round:

Note!

The shooters re-shoot their first missed target as their 25th shot immediately following the missed shot. If the target missed is in a double, the target missed first shall be re-shot as a single target.

If no targets are missed, the 25th shell is shot at the low house station 8.

3. Throwing distance of targets

Targets are thrown to 55.00 - 60.00 m (calm weather, measured from the wall of the high and the low house.

4. Shooting stance

The position of the stock can be chosen freely or it can be already mounted on the shoulder.

5. Finals

No finals

6. Ties and shoot off

All ties before and after finals shall be broken in shoot off by sudden death. The first double (high house – low house) is shot from station 3, the second (high house – low house) from station 4, the third (low house – high house) from station 4 and the fourth (low house – high house) from station 5. If the tie is not broken, the shoot off will continue from station 3 as long as the tie is broken.
